Email us on the address at the top of the page or contact the Hall if you would be willing to be part of a gardening group to keep our village pretty.


We hope you enjoy reading the articles from some of our local groups.

FOREST FARM

Thank you so much to everyone who visited Forest Farm over the summer and for your amazing support. From proposals to wedding parties, first dates to puppy dates, our team has loved seeing friends and families enjoying gelato and coffee in the garden.

This summer has been particularly special, with the gelato garden hosting a hare sculpture for Clan Cancer Support's Big Hop Trail. With your help, we are delighted to have raised over £8,000 and counting for the charity this year.

While Autumn may be approaching, we remain open every day 10am to 8pm (self-service milk vending machines open 6.30am to 8pm). Our fairy lights and heated domes will soon be on to enjoy cozy evenings with a hot chocolate or pumpkin spice latte.

We are also excited to announce that we will soon be serving up handmade pizza, alongside our drinks and gelato! Our dough will be made fresh on site every day and cooked in our new pizza oven, which arrived from Italy last month. For those who are new to the Forest Farm, we are a family run organic dairy in Kinellar. As an organic farm, our focus is on farming sustainably, by using no artificial pesticides or fertilisers, creating wildlife habitats and looking after our animals to the highest welfare standards. The organic milk produced on our farm is pasteurised fresh each morning in our onsite creamery, with no food miles, and available to purchase in reusable glass bottles.

Here are a few things you might not know about the farm:

- All of our award-winning gelato is made in our purpose-built creamery and gelato kitchen on the farm. Every flavour is carefully developed using the finest fresh ingredients and churned in small batches. Our in-house bakers make all the homemade inclusions and ingredients to fold, infuse, ripple and crumble in the gelato.
- We also produce a range of dairy free sorbet, which won a Gold Award at the Royal Highland Show this year.
- This year we launched our pop-up parlour, which can be booked to serve gelato at events and weddings. We also make gelato cakes, which will soon be available to order online.
- From farmers to front of house we have a brilliant team of over 30 people, many of whom live in Blackburn and the surrounding area.
- We are working with Kemnay Academy to offer Foundation Apprenticeships in the business and also host free educational tours of the farm for schools and groups throughout the year.
- We are proud to farm organically and love to show off our cows. You can watch our cows being milked every day at 3.30pm.

We have some exciting plans at Forest Farm over the next year and some of our best ideas have been inspired by our customers. <u>KINTORE LIBRARY</u>: Would you like to access newspapers, magazines, e-books and audio books for free online? – then please read on.


