#### **COUNCILLOR REPORT**

#### Blackburn/Thainstone New Daily Express Bus Service

Great news for residents of Blackburn and Thainstone as Stagecoach Bluebird will be launching a new commercial daily express service M96 which will operate between Inverness and Aberdeen.

This service will commence on 12 June 2023, and will operate a limited stop to provide a faster service, following requests from passengers, which will only serve the bus stops listed below within Aberdeenshire.

Huntly (Deveron Road, outside Tesco).
Blackburn (Main Road at/opposite Leys hotel)

The service will also stop ON REQUEST at Thainstone Market, Great Northern Road at North Anderson Drive.

The service will operate eight busses per day, in both directions.

The first northbound bus, will depart Aberdeen at 0730 and arrive in Blackburn at 0805 with the last one departing Aberdeen at 2130, arriving in Blackburn at 2205. The first southbound bus will depart Blackburn at 0635, arriving in Aberdeen at 0710, with the last one departing Blackburn at 2005, arriving in Aberdeen at 2040 (please check the timetable/app). The existing service 10 (Aberdeen – Inverness) is unaffected by this new initiative.

### Finally - a Comfort Partnership for Kintore – Blackburn next please

Since I first became elected in 2017, I have been trying to get more public conveniences in my ward. I initially campaigned for toilets at the then soon to be built Kintore Station, but Network Rail/Scotrail and Aberdeenshire Council wouldn't agree to it.

Since then, I have pursued the Comfort Partnership scheme where a local service provider makes available a free of charge toilet facility to all members of the public during their normal opening hours, with no expectation that the users of the toilet facilities are expected to purchase any goods or services from them.

Whilst co-owner of The Crafty Café for three years, I tried to get the café added to the scheme, but due to budget restrictions it wasn't possible.

However, I continued to argue that it was ridiculous that a town of almost 5,000 people had no public convenience, and I am now delighted to announce that The Crafty Café has been added.

The Crafty Café is working in partnership with Aberdeenshire Council to provide a free of charge toilet facility to residents and visitors to Kintore. The Crafty Cafe is open:

Monday to Friday 10am to 4pm Saturdays 10am to 2pm.

This is great news for Kintore, the café and for visitors and I would just like to thank Council officers and Margita and her team for helping make this happen. I am now pushing for signage, so that visitors know where the public convenience is.

I have again raised the need for a Comfort Partnership in Blackburn, and I will be continuing to argue for this to happen asap. I have spoken with the very community minded Kinellar Hall and they are willing to support such an arrangement.

#### Kemnay Academy Bus Park and PROPOSED Extension

Earlier this year, a project to provide Kemnay Academy with a much-needed bus park was approved by the Garioch Area Committee.

As well as a bus park providing 16 bays, space will create for a drop off and pick up facility. Kemnay Academy has 70% of its pupils using some form of school transport, the second highest in Aberdeenshire, and buses currently have to use limited layby space on Bremner Way.

However, as many of you will be aware, Kemnay Academy has consistently been over capacity, and I have argued repeatedly that action needs to be taken to address this situation. Education officers agree and plans for an extension have been drawn up.

Currently, there is no identified budget for this extension (details below) that Education officers, pupils, parents and the community know is needed.

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Blackie Banter is compiled by a small group of volunteers, it is also delivered by volunteers, to around 1200 homes. 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I am in opposition and am doing my best to argue for its inclusion in the capital plan. I have asked that the Administration councillors (Tory/Lib Dem and Independents) who represent this area, go to their groups and argue the case for this vital extension.

Money was found for new academies in Ellon (£36 million, 2015) and Inverurie (£55 million, 2020) and there is a new academy planned for Peterhead.

This project will be expensive, but it is an extension, not a new build. It is urgently required and in its entirety.

It is time that this was delivered for Kemnay, Blackburn and Kintore.

The background and proposals are:

Last year, Education officers presented plans for a new extension to address the issues of overcapacity and 'temporary' accommodation. I was quite frustrated that these plans were not advanced last year, but in March this year, officers firmed up their proposed plans to extend the academy.

Their rationale is that:

Permanent accommodation is required to replace non-linked accommodation.

Enable an increase in published capacity.

Accommodate rising roll within future accommodation.

Support fluctuations in pupil subject choice by offering increase in flexible accommodation.

Refurbish Practical subject areas to improve Suitability Core Fact Assessment.

Increase accommodation in practical areas in line with curriculum demands and anticipated school roll.

Improved collaboration opportunities between school-based partners and organisations in fit for purpose facilities.

Align academy accommodation to Learning Estates Strategy principles and secondary school brief.

The scope of the proposed extension/project is:

Replace the non-linked accommodation with a permanent structure which includes sufficient general teaching classrooms supporting future growth at the academy.

Increase in practical subject spaces in areas of Drama, HE and Technical, including learning spaces to support the delivery of Foundation Apprenticeships.

Collaborative spaces for school partner agencies are also required to enhance the support offered to young people.

Creation of a bus park.

The project would deliver:

An additional Drama Studio and Wood Workshop Replacement of all temporary accommodation Increase in classrooms/learning plaza Art department storage Partner collaboration space Catering and dining considerations Bus Park

Kemnay Academy Existing Accommodation:

Total Practical - 26

Total Non - Practical - 41\*

\*includes 10 classrooms within non-linked accommodation

Kemnay Academy Future Accommodation:

Total Practical - 29

Total Non - Practical - 45

The published capacity is 730 and the current working capacity is 980, however this would be increased to a target capacity of 1200.

FORESTRY AND LAND SCOTLAND'S POPULAR 'STAY THE NIGHT' IS RETURNING TO AROUND 36 CAR PARKS ACROSS SCOTLAND FOR THE 2023 SEASON.

From 1 April until 31 October 2022, self-contained motorhomes and campervans (with all facilities including toilet inside the vehicle) will be permitted to park overnight, for one night only, in some of our car parks.

This year, FLS will also be asking visitors who take up the opportunity of paying a modest charge of £7 per stay, payable via the RingGo app

Stuart Chalmers, FLS' National Visitor Services Manager, said; "Stay the Night has proved to be hugely popular with motorhome and campervan users, many of whom have indicated that they would be more than happy to pay a small charge for their stay. "It's really gratifying to know that the motorhome community respects our sites and the other visitors that will stop for the night. However, there is always the small minority that doesn't play by the rules and to make sure that they don't spoil it for everyone else, our seasonal rangers regularly check each of the participating car parks.

"The modest £7 charge per night will help us to cover those additional costs and make sure that our visitors all enjoy a great experience.

"Stay the Night helps to meet the growing demand for stopping places and by encouraging people to stop at locations they would otherwise have passed through, should also provide a boost to many small rural businesses."

Full details including a list and location map of all the sites will be available <u>online</u> soon. Stays are for one night only between the hours of 6 pm and 10 am, with no return visit for 48 hrs.

Stay the Night is only for self-contained motorhomes and campervans. This means vehicles that include accommodation and toilet facilities. It doesn't include tents beside cars, or pop-up toilet tents, or any motorhome or campervan without its own toilet facility. And no generators are permitted.

No booking system is in place and the participating car parks will operate on a first come first served basis.


