LOCAL COUNCILLOR UPDATE - Jim Gifford

Thank you for the opportunity to contribute to this edition of the Blackie Banter.

In an article last year, I mentioned that the new Local Development Plan (LDP) was now in place for Aberdeenshire (<u>Aberdeenshire Local Development Plan 2023</u>, <u>Aberdeenshire Council</u>) and highlighted the opportunities for individuals, groups and communities to contribute to the process of developing the next LDP – a five-year process that starts as soon as the current plan is signed off.

Another element of community input to local planning are the relatively new processes of Local Place Plans (LPPs). LPPs are a new right for communities to produce their own plans as part of the planning system. They contain the community's proposals for the development and use of land and provide a new opportunity for communities to feed into the planning system with their own ideas and proposals. The aim of the provision is to significantly enhance engagement in development planning and effectively empower communities to play a proactive role in defining the future of their places. Communities can bring forward their own proposals and suggestions for the development and use of land that reflect national and local outcomes. The LPPs that are currently being developed are generally being taken forward by community councils but other groups can also take the lead and work up a LPP for their area. If anyone is interested in looking at the LPP process, community councils or groups who wish to receive more information should email delivery@aberdeenshire.gov.uk.

On the subject of Community Councils – Kinellar hasn't had one for years and the area is missing out by not having a voice representing them. Community Councils are statutory consultees on matters like planning and they are regularly asked for their opinions on many issues and proposed changes in national or council policy. So, your community needs you. A list of 20 signatures and some people willing to take on some key roles like Chair and Secretary and a new body can be created and then supported by the area office. Council Officers will actually be in attendance at the Blackburn Gala Day on 15th of June and would love to talk to you about forming a new Community Council – or anything else for that matter.

Having set a very difficult budget back in February, the challenge now is for the council and all of our services to deliver what is possible within our restricted funding. Knowing these challenges, and in expectation of what is likely to come over the next few years, the council agreed at the budget meeting to start a process of creating a new Council Plan. This will re-focus the priorities for the council over the next 5-6 years and try and plan the best use of the resources that we do have. If projections are correct, by 2030 our over-65 year old population will increase by 28% while at the same time, our working age population and young children will drop by 2% each and the number of school-age children will drop by 7%. The council services that we will need then will be different from what we have now and we have started the process of getting from here to there. We will keep everyone aware of changes as they emerge and make sure that all of our residents are involved in the discussions for each and every change. This would be a key role for your community council so if that can be re-instated, I think it would be a benefit to all. Contact me on cllr.j.gifford@aberdeenshire.gov.uk or 07766 497856.

A HISTORY OF BLACKBURN AND KINELLAR DISTRICT

He was one of the youth club leaders for a while and fondly recalls some of the activities in which he participated.

Because if one person drops a piece of litter, more people start to drop litter in the same place until it's too much and then has to be cleaned!

Why do a litter pick, you ask? Well, clearing all the litter encourages people not to litter because they don't see any around them. Our local wildlife is also suffering from mistaking litter for a scrumptious meal. This seriously affects them and soon animals will die out. This is heartbreaking. We need a solution to stop this from happening. By taking part in this litter pick, P5 took one small step for us and one giant leap for the environment!

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CLINTERTY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE: Information sourced from Wikipedia

The buildings collectively forming Clinterty College are I'm sure a familiar site to most, but I expect few will know about the history of the college. Founded in 1968 with the purchase of Meikle Clinterty Farm and then the following year Mains of Tertowie. Initially classes were taught in surplus school provision in Bucksburn and students ferried out to the farm at Meikle Clinterty for practical activities.

Construction of the new college started in 1973 on its current site and opened its doors to students in September 1975. The college provided training and education in Agricultural skills, Crop and Animal Husbandry, Mechanisation plus Agricultural and Construction Plant Engineering.

The college developed with the appointment of various Heads of Departments. New college buildings including a teaching block, engineering workshop and hostel were completed in 1975. New innovative courses in Recreation and Tourism, Outdoor Pursuits, Horticulture, Arboriculture, Equine Studies and Small Animal Care were introduced during the 1980s.

The college had 3 distinct farm units: Meikle Clinterty. Which was mainly used as a pig unit, a new dairy unit was built at Clinterty in an area known as the Haughs and Mains of Tertowie housed the beef and sheep units. After the majority of the farms and land were sold Clinterty continued to offer courses in subjects such as small animal care and service engineering although these have since been reduced to just courses in gardening.

After the amalgamation of Clinterty with Aberdeen College the farms were sold off and the facilities at Clinterty have largely been used by Aset, the college's commercial training company for the oil, gas, engineering and construction industries. Aset rent the property they occupy, which is still owned by Aberdeen College, and the company has gained international recognition for some of the training courses they run.

Aberdeen College has further amalgamated with Banff and Buchan College to be renamed North East Scotland College, more commonly referred to as NESCOL. *Jenny Chapman*
